Grain Market Update: Lincoln Hillyer, VP of Grain

Grains have experienced an uptrend to start 2019. The main driver has been continued optimism in U.S./China negotiations and weather concerns in South America. With the government shutdown, export news is harder to come by, but many in the trade are hearing of China shopping around for U.S. soybeans. While the quantities are small at this point, it is a good sign longer term. On South America, Brazil has been experiencing dry weather over a good portion on its production area. Estimates on the Brazilian bean crop have been reduced, but they are still looking at a large crop.

Bottom line, things have not changed much over the past month. We continue to be awash in soybeans and the corn market continues to trade in a range. Expect more of the same until more is known about South American weather and U.S. acres.

As we see rallies, be ready to sell new crop values. With carries in the board, we are seeing some attractive levels for next year. Don't be afraid to lock in some bushels and take some risk off the table. Target orders are a great way to scale up your sales. Give the grain department a call to get started!
