While corn and soybean ending stocks came in below trade expectations, the report proved we still have plenty of bushels. When you put that with another large harvest we are working through now, it is difficult to get too excited about our current supply/demand situation.

Since our last update, Padonia has started taking corn at the new bin and leg complex. Everything is running smoothly there. Also, our scale and receiving project in downtown Hiawatha has been completed. We will be in position to take soybeans downtown once the weather dries up.
