



Grain Market Update

The talk of the week was tariffs. China announced Wednesday \$50 billion in tariffs on US imported goods, which included soybeans. And last night President Trump released a statement about implementing another \$100 billion of tariffs on Chinese imports. China's announcements so far is just a proposal with no dates set. In the meantime, both futures and cash markets have shown more volatility than we've seen in several years. Soybeans have recovered a good portion of the losses experienced Wednesday, and gulf basis has risen despite the announcement. Brazil has placed a stronghold on their massive bean crop knowing they will be the main supplier to China if tariffs do go into effect. The US, on the other hand, has seen other countries come to the table to supply their demands.

While the volatility is enjoyed by traders, it is never exciting to have markets so focused on politics. There is a lot of uncertainty right now, and the best advice is to continue to sell in small increments. To many, we are still at levels we did not anticipate this year, and it only takes one action on either side of the Pacific to dramatically affect the markets. Hitting the high is not the goal.
