New Nematode Nemesis — NemaStrike: Tyler DiGiacomo

Monsanto officially received approval of the EPA to accept the release of NemaStrike earlier this spring. NemaStrike is a product now offered by Monsanto Seed Applied Solutions, which targets and attacks nematodes. This nematicide product has a mode of action that stays in the root zone where nematodes thrive. We are currently testing some innovation trials at Ag Partners that will give us data on plant health. Essentially, if nematodes are present in the soil, we want to know how they are affecting our soybeans. For the past three years in Monsanto's field development trials, this product has shown a 68% positive response rate in soybeans, with a 3-bushel increase in yield, when applied to the seed.

In our own independent innovation trials this spring, we placed this product with multiple growers across the region. During the evaluation process, we will monitor nematode pressure in the control area and the NemaStrike applied area, and document any visual differences.
