I hope you all had a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! Fuel prices continue to rise. In fact, diesel prices have risen .30-.40 in the last six weeks. This can be attributed to a couple of things. Prices started to rise once it was announced that the Biden Administration would be coming into office. Rhetoric has been that the Biden Administration is not as favorable to the Energy Sector, so that threw some upward swings in the market. At about the same time, it was announced that vaccinations would be coming out for COVID-19. Ag Partners Accounting Software Change

On February 1, 2021, Ag Partners will switch accounting software systems. With this change, statements, sales tickets, and payment receipts will change in appearance. A brochure will be delivered with your statement in March, and be available on our website, to help with understanding the new statement format.

To help with the system transition, Mr. Tire Service Center in Seneca, KS, will be closed on Saturday, January 30, to allow the accounting staff to work on data conversion. We also request that customers get their payments into an Ag Partners location by January 28 to allow time to post them and have a clean cutoff of customer account data.

With this software change, we will also have a new online portal for access to account information. This portal, Merchant Ag, will contain all account information from February 1, 2021, and forward. All account information from January 31, 2021, and prior will be available in the current online portal, MyGrower. Links to both portals will be available on our website.

The Merchant Ag Portal will provide all of the same information and services as MyGrower, plus more, like purchase totals for tax reporting and the ability to make payments online. User information for those who already have a MyGrower account will be automatically transferred over into the new Merchant Ag portal soon after the software switch happens, so keep an eye out for an email confirmation.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we go through this transition; we look forward to the tools and efficiency that our new software will provide to help us better serve you.
