As we start to hit somewhat of a slow downtime, it is time to start thinking ahead to maintenance on your harvest equipment. Ag Partners is currently running a sale of 10% off all grease products through the end of July. Along with this, we have the Cenex Gift Cards for Gallons promotion going on too. For every (4) 10 packs of grease or 35# pail you purchase, you are eligible to receive a \$15 VISA gift card. For every 120# keg of qualifying grease, you are eligible for a \$50 VISA gift card. Also, did you know that we offer Bulk Oil delivery right to your farm? Please call us for details on this.

Propane contracts were sent out the week of June 29th for home heating. This year, we are again offering multiple ways to lock in your gallons. We have Full Prepay, \$0.25/gallon down deposit, and Level Pay options available. If you do not receive one in the next week, please do not hesitate to call our office to ensure we get you taken care of. Grain drying contracts will be sent out in the coming weeks.

The outlook on prices for 2021 is still looking attractive. If you have any interest in doing so, please contact Eric Osterhaus at 785-294-2722 to discuss different options on contracting fuels for next year. Crude Oil and refined fuel prices have started to strengthen over the last month or so. As the states open back up and businesses get back to a somewhat normal procedure, demand should start to pick up, which in turn should raise fuel prices.

Agronomy Update

Future First Fertilizer

MAP

Current – 131 bushels to buy 1 Ton of MAP 3 Year Avg—143 bushels to buy 1 Ton of MAP

Potash

Current – 106 bushels to buy 1 ton of Potash 3 Year Avg – 109 bushels to buy 1 ton of Potash

UAN

Current – 70 bushels to buy 1 ton of UAN 3 Year Avg – 75 bushels to buy 1 ton of UAN

Ag Partners is currently recommending that customers look at taking a position of 25% to 50% of their anticipated fall dry application needs on phosphate and potash and consider 50% of their yearly anticipated UAN needs.

Agronomy Update Continued 2020 Corn Fungicide

As we approach the time of year for fungicide applications on corn, we need to consider a few items when it comes to the products we choose. The first consideration is what are we trying to accomplish with a fungicide application. For the geography that Ag Partners serves, we would recommend a focus on products that will give coverage on Grey Leaf Spot and Southern Rust. Timing of an application also needs to be a factor. The optimal time for application is after tassel and before brown silk to allow for the maximum potential ROI. The final consideration needs to be what is actually in the jug. Pay special attention to which and how much of each active ingredient is in a product.

Grain Update

What a difference a report makes! The USDA report published June 30th provided the spark needed to rally grains. By far, the most surprising number was the planted corn acres, coming in at 92.0 million. In the March report, the estimate was 97.0 million. The reduction mainly comes from prevent plant acres. While many believed the number would come down, the trade was caught off guard by the sharp drop.

Despite the changes, with decent weather to finish out the growing season, we are still looking at a huge crop. The market really needs demand to kick in, which has struggled with a competitive market globally, and the issues currently facing the ethanol industry. The bean market is also facing its own issues with sloppy crush economics and an export program that needs a boost.

Ag Partners continues to move forward with multiple grain projects this summer. The new steel bins going up in Padonia and Tarkio are on schedule to be operational this fall harvest. The board also approved a bunker expansion in Corning. The goal of this project is to handle bushels much more efficiently and quickly than in the past. We understand the need for the grower to get to and from the field as fast as possible and this design will provide just that.

Purchases have really ramped up following the June 30th report. Now is a great time to look at prices and position yourself for fall harvest.
