### **Status by Crop**

Corn: V4 - V8

Soybeans: V1 – R1

Potatoes: 20 – 30"

Cabbage: 7 leaves – Heading

Carrots: 3 true leaf – 7 true leaves



### Pheromone & Blacklight Traps

- Almond
  - 1 Western BeanCutworm
  - 7 True Armyworm
  - 2 Cabbage Looper
  - 1 Diamondback Moth
- Stevens Point
  - 9 Western BeanCutworm
  - 3 True Armyworm

- Coloma
  - 0 Cabbage Looper
  - 1 Diamondback Moth
- Grand Marsh
  - 0 Western BeanCutworm
  - 40 True Armyworm
  - 1 European Corn Borer
  - 4 Cabbage Looper
  - 31 Spotted Cutworm



#### Corn



With the storms we had this pasted week your corn may experience some storm damage.

Pushed over corn is caused by wind.



### Soybeans



Reminder to spray your soybean before they reach their R stages for weeds.



#### **Potatoes**

Early planted potatoes are now reaching the blooming stage. If you notice early blooming, be mindful of the insecticides you're applying to ensure they are safe for use during this growth phase.





### **Colorado Potato Beetle Status**



After the hot weather last weekend, we have seen an explosion in the larva and have been finding 3<sup>rd</sup> instar larva



#### **Potatoes**

With the recent weather, it is important to be applying fungicides to help delay early blight and prevent late blight.





#### **Carrots**

When your carrots have reach 25% canopy is time to start your fungicide program.
