



### **CoBank Awards \$10,000 Matching Grant to Midway Coop Ag Fund**

**OSBORNE, Kan.** — The Midway Coop Ag Fund has received a \$10,000 matching grant from CoBank through its **Sharing Success** program, doubling Midway Coop's recent \$10,000 contribution to the fund.

Sharing Success is CoBank's annual charitable matching program that supports organizations important to its customer-owners and the communities they serve. As a customer-owner of CoBank, Midway Coop was eligible to nominate a qualifying 501(c)(3) organization it supported during the year. CoBank then matched the cooperative's contribution dollar for dollar.

Established in 2024 with the Osborne County Community Foundation (OCCF), the Midway Coop Ag Fund is designed to strengthen agriculture across the cooperative's regional operating area, which includes Jewell, Osborne, Russell, and Smith counties. The fund creates grant opportunities for agriculture-related projects, FFA programs, and 4-H clubs within those communities.

The Midway Coop Ag Fund began producing grants in 2025 and will again open for grant applications during OCCF's second-quarter competitive grant cycle, beginning March 1, 2026. Applications will be available at [www.osborneccf.org](http://www.osborneccf.org).
