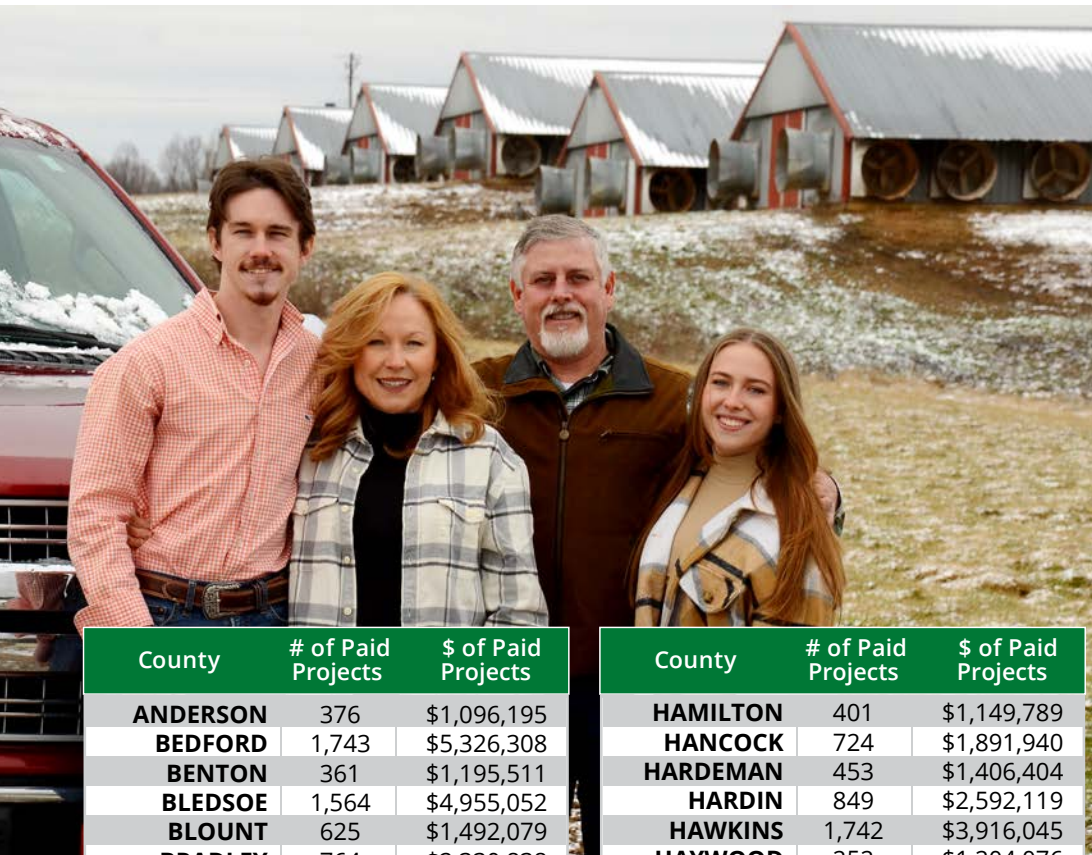


LIVESTOCK SOLUTIONS
