If hay is provided in addition to Co-op Pinnacle Senior, limit daily hay intake to 0.5 lb per 100 lb of body weight. Feed similar amounts at the same time each day to minimize digestive upset. Monitor the horse's body condition and adjust feeding practices to maintain an appropriate level of condition. If feeding a grain ration at a rate of 0.50 lb per 100 lb of body weight per day or more, divide total amount into 2 or 3 individual meals offered over 10 to 12 hours. Avoid abrupt changes in feed or forage type. Implement any changes to the diet over a 7 to 10 day transitional period. Changes in the amount of a grain ration should not exceed 1.00 to 1.50 lb per day. Provide clean, fresh water at all times.
